The Workplace Experience Exchange Camp II is an immersive summer experience for educators, connecting classroom teaching to real-world business and industry trends, skill requirements, experiences, and opportunities, with an intense focus on the skills needed in today's workforce.

WHY WEE CAMP II

Educators become better at their jobs when they can relate real-world examples to the content delivered to their students. Thus, the Workplace Exchange (WEE) Camp was born in 2015 as Central Louisiana's first industry externship program for educators.

The goal of WEE Camp is to provide experiences for educators to learn through direct, hands-on experience about trends, skill requirements, and opportunities in industries within the region.

WEE Camp is often the first time that Cenla educators are granted access to step into the workplace and view regional jobs through their students' eyes. As they walk through and experience the operations at partnering job sites, educators cultivate a new appreciation for the skills and proficiencies their students will need in their future careers. They receive insight into workplace practices, policies, and needed skills for today's jobs.

WEE Camp II focuses on the manufacturing and healthcare sectors, two of Cenla's fastest growing sectors. For two full days, educators are immersed in the day-to-day operations of some of the region's key manufacturers and healthcare providers. The program uses inquiry-based learning, which challenges educators to think more like employers. WEE Camp II then joins WEE Camp 1 for the remainder of the WEE Camp program.




All educators said that the WEE Camp experience spent at each was related to their own subject matter.
